Alfred-Almond Elementary School Closure Grading Plan

- No grade will be posted for a stand-alone 3rd marking period.
- Students will receive a Pass or Incomplete for the combined 3rd & 4th marking period. The determination of Pass/Incomplete will be based on work assigned between the first day of the 3rd marking period through the end of the school year.
- The report card will indicate the P or INC for each course for the combined 3rd/4th marking period.

2-Tier Indicator Options

Grade	Option
Passing	Meeting or exceeding expectations
Incomplete	Not engaged in learning OR Falling below expectations

In all cases:

- Students should remain engaged in, and accountable for, the work that is being sent home during the period of school closure. Successful completion of this work is essential for demonstrating readiness to move on to the next level of learning.
 Students who have an INC for the 3rd/4th quarter will not be eligible to receive course credit until they do the work necessary to clear the INC. If extenuating circumstances exist that preclude a student from engaging in this work, this needs to be communicated with the teacher, counselor, and/or building administrator.
- Teachers will continue to provide students with formative feedback on work being completed and will mark their grade books with "T" for "Turned In" or "M" for "missing" (or "I" for "incomplete"). ALL work is recorded as UNWEIGHTED as no grades are being calculated for work done during the period of school closure.
 Teachers may use the "comments" portion of their grade book to record performance feedback.
- Teachers should continue to make the school psychologist, counselors, and administrators aware of students for whom they have concerns due to a lack of connection or engagement with the home learning plans.

Administrators, School Psychologist, and Counselors working with teachers will
continue close monitoring of students at risk of not passing, or with Incompletes
recorded for essential work and/or quarterly grades, to support those students in
meeting the requirements for the grade level.
