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Message from the Superintendent

Happy New Year!

I am pleased to announce that on December 15, 2021, the Board of Education appointed Mr. Christopher Smith to the new School Security Officer position at Alfred-Almond Central School. Please join me in giving him a warm welcome to our District. Mr. Smith assumed his duties on January 3, 2022.

Mr. Smith recently retired after a 33-year career with the New York State Police. He comes to us with a depth of diverse experiences, including having served as a former School Resource Officer in a local school district. He holds the Civil Service title of School Security Officer, albeit the district intends to view this position not only for security, but also as a proactive resource to students, faculty, staff and administration on school-related matters. Mr. Smith will wear school logo apparel and will carry a firearm, which he will re-certify with twice per year.

An overview of the duties and responsibilities he will hold include, but are not limited to, the following:

- provide security for students and staff within the buildings and grounds
- conduct student misconduct investigations and support administration with reports
- monitor the district and bus surveillance systems
- serve as a role model to students, especially in terms of appropriate behavior and respect
- monitor and support chronic absentees (including home visits, if necessary)
- attend after school functions, as deemed necessary
- counsel students either individually or as a group on school and non-school safety topics including social media usage, drug abuse prevention, etc.
- promote a safe learning environment and deter misconduct through high visibility and developing positive rapport with students
- serve as a member of the District Safety Committee
- communicate and maintain positive relationships with law enforcement

We are fortunate to have Mr. Smith join our team and look forward to the positive contributions he and this position will provide our AACS educational community.

I hope this new year brings you all much-deserved health, happiness and peace.

The students learned many different skills such as


teamwork, leadership and communication throughout the competition. These transferable skills will follow them throughout their lives.

STAR credit information

Pligible new homeowners will receive their STAR savings in the form of a check directly from New York State. New Basic and En-



hanced STAR applicants must register with the New York State Tax Department to receive a STAR check. Register anytime at www.tax.ny.gov/star or by phone weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (518-457-2036). Register by July 1 to receive your STAR check in September. If you register after July 1, you will receive your check later.

STAR eligibility requirements

If you own your home, it's your primary residence, and if your income is \$500,000 or less, you're eligible for the Basic STAR credit.

If you're 65 or older with an income of \$86,300 or less, you may be eligible for the Enhanced STAR credit.

Before you register

You'll need this information to register for the STAR credit:

- names and Social Security numbers for all owners of the property and their spouses (you may be asked to enter this information more than once to show the relationships between owners)
- the primary residence of the owners and their spouses
- approximate date the owners purchased the property and the name of the sellers (this information is not required, but it can help us to smoothly process your registration)
- the most recent school tax bill, if the current owners received one
- address of any residential property owned in an other state
- the legal name of the trust, if applicable
- 2018 federal or state income tax returns for all owners. If you weren't required to file a 2018 income tax return, you be asked to provide financial information for all property owners.

STAR exemption recipients

You don't need to register with New York State for STAR if you're a longtime homeowner with an existing STAR exemption. If you're a senior citizen who has been receiving the Basic STAR exemption and has become eligible for the Enhanced STAR exemption, you should apply with your local assessor.

Alfred-Almond KINDERGARTEN SIGN-UPS FOR SEPTEMBER 2022

In order to identify all children who will enter Kindergarten in September 2022, we are asking those parents who have eligible children who **DO NOT CURRENTLY ATTEND THE PRE-K PROGRAM** to complete this form and return it to the elementary school by April 15, 2022. Your child must be 5 years of age on or before

December 1, 2022. This information is necessary when we initiate Kindergarten sign-ups in the spring. We will use this information below to generate a mailing list for sending the actual registration packets. Students currently attending the Pre-K will automatically be sent a packet. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Thank you.
