

BRETT FAVRE RETURNS

Brett Favre was born in Gulfport, Mississippi, in 1969. He attended the University Southern Mississippi where he had a very successful college football career. Brett set several school records and was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons in 1991, as the 33rd overall selection. After one season with the Falcons, Brett was traded to the Green Bay Packers. There, Favre went on to have 16 successful and record breaking seasons. He led his team to two Super Bowls, including Super Bowl XXXI, where the Packers were victorious. Brett also became the first National Football League (NFL) player to win three straight MVP awards. While on his run with the Packers, Brett set the record for most consecutive games started, with 297 games. This streak started September 20, 1992 and ended on January 20, 2008. In 2008, the Packers traded Favre to the New York Jets where spent one season. Brett Favre ended his career with the Vikings for Minnesota two seasons. Brett Favre retired for January 2011. He good in finished with two NFL records, one in passing with 71,838 yards and one in touchdowns with 508. Favre was one of Green Bays greatest players and will be inducted into the Packers Hall of Fame in 2016. His number was retired in 2015.

After five years of retirement with plenty of commercials for Wrangler, Micro Touch, Tough Blades, Wix, and Copper Fit, Brett Favre is coming back to the NFL!

O.J. Simpson Murder Case

According to Doug Linder, an American author, the trial of Orenthal James Simpson was said to be a "trashy novel comes to life." O.J. Simpson, the famous football star for teams USC, Buffalo Bills, and 49ers, had been acquitted of murdering his wife, Nicole Brown Simpson, and her acquaintance Ronald Goldman. With no evidence of a weapon, O.J. tried to argue that he had not killed either Nicole or Ronald, but his story just didn't add up. O.J. had been ordered to pay compensatory damages of \$8.5 million, and punitive damages of \$25 million to the families of Nicole and Ronald. However, after one year, three months, and 20 days, O.J. walked away free of any charges.

Members of the Los Police Department Angeles (LAPD) are now on their toes, as they were introduced to new evidence; a knife has recently been discovered on the, now demolished. property of O.J. Simpson. A construction worker found the knife and immediately turned the newly found evidence the 1995 over to case's investigator.

After obtaining this new information, the current supervisor collected the knife and had a team begin to conduct DNA tests and any other evidence that could help solve the case. Norma Eisenman, a speaker for the LAPD, told *The Independent:* "We are confirming that conducting tests on a knife that was recovered."

A murder weapon had not been found nor presented to the jury during the trial in 1995. Captain Andrew Neiman expressed that the forensics team is currently conducting tests and stated, "We [the LAPD forensics team] have to determine whether it is evidence or not."

The police department is unsure of whether this is just a bogus story from a man who wanted attention, or if it truly is the weapon that was used to kill Nicole Brown Simpson and Ronald Goldman.

Recently, Neiman has come to the conclusion that the discovery of the knife is quite a coincidence. There is a TV series documenting the facts and events of Simpson's case. So of course, Neiman thought it coincidental that the knife was found during the middle of the popular TV series.

The Captain still believes there needs to be valid evidence to support this new finding, but the LAPD is ready to take the necessary actions to solve this case.




The dung beetle is a beetle that is known for rolling dung (animal droppings) around on the ground. The dung beetle is found worldwide on all continents except Antarctica. Their habitats range from deserts to forests. A dung beetle uses the collected dung to feed from, and they also lay their eggs into it. The dung beetle belongs to one of three groups; the rollers, the tunnelers, and the dwellers. The rollers shape dung into the the shape of a ball, and then roll it away so they can bury it. The tunnelers bury their dung by tunneling under the pile of dung. The dwellers live inside of the dung pile. Dung beetles feed dung primarily herbivores. Their larvae eat liquid dung while adults eat solid dung. Dung beetles come in various colors, but most are black.

The seed is the size and shape of antelope dung and it also smells like dung. The seed and dung have so much in common the seed tricks dung beetles into rolling it like dung. By rolling and burying the seed the dung beetle actually plants the seed. Now that is a *crappy* trick.


Paisley the ventriloquist!!

Questioning Credibility?

These days, it seems like information is all around us. Between our devices and the internet, we have a wealth of knowledge at our fingertips. However, not everything we read and see is always true. It's up to us as individuals to evaluate a particular resource, using clues (and a little bit of common sense) to help us determine whether or not the information is **credible**. Below are several questions you can ask yourself when deciding what's true and what's not.



- 1. What is the purpose of the information? Is it to inform? Persuade? Entertain?
- 2. Is the information you read considered fact, opinion, or propaganda?
- 3. Does the information appear to be well researched? Is clear, specific evidence used to back up claims?
 - 4. Are the sources of the information used clearly identified?
- 5. Can you **verify** the information with your own knowledge or outside research?
- 6. Are there general statements that may be overstating or understating the issue?
- 7. Looking over the entire source, is there any indication that the information may be unreliable?

Inform = Should include clear facts (Is the evidence backed up/from a reputable source? Is the author an expert? Does it sound like they did research?)

<u>Persuade</u> = This means an author is trying to convince you of something, which usually involves opinions. Are these opinions supported with evidence? Are both sides of the issue considered?

<u>Entertain</u> = If something is written in order to be entertaining, there is a chance that information may be exaggerated or skewed in order to appeal to a certain audience. It's always a good idea to check the facts.

Facts = You should be able to confirm facts through your own research/knowledge. Evidence and cited sources should be present.

<u>Opinion</u> = Is what you're reading a proven truth, or is it just the author's personal viewpoint?

Propaganda = This is used to persuade people to think or act a certain way. Remember to check the facts!

Information that has been well researched is usually specific and thorough. If details seem to be left out, or no proof is offered to support statements, then you should be wary.

Any time the source of information, quotes, facts, statistics, etc. is not directly provided, you should do more research/question the reliability.

It doesn't hurt to look for outside information! Look up the topic/fact that you are questioning, and get a "second" (or even third) opinion.

If broad, vague statements are being given instead of providing specifics, you may want to do more research.

Are there any clues that the source is meant to be taken lightly? Is humor/satire included? Are there any disclaimers that accompany the information? If so, tread carefully.

In conclusion, while the internet can be a great source of information, it is always a good idea to be skeptical when viewing anything found online. Check the facts, use your best judgement, and take the time to evaluate the credibility of your source. Doing so will make you a responsible, critical digital citizen, rather than an [April] fool!




